Important Insurance Note

Whilst coaching and matches are supervised to minimise the risk of injury, rugby is a physical contact game. The benefits under the compulsory RFC Insurance Cover are low, even for serious injury, and do not cover loss of earnings. It is therefore recommended that additional cover be taken out. Please note that the club, its servants, agents or employees will not be responsible for supervising junior players before or after coaching sessions or matches. The RFU encourages players to have an up-to-date tetanus injection. A properly fitted gum shield recommended and is compulsory for all U9 to U12 players. A head guard is also recommended.

WARNING: INSURANCE

The benefits under the RFU compulsory insurance scheme are for only the most serious of injuries. Furthermore, they do not cover loss of earnings. Use of the Gym should only be after an Induction Course and should always be with another adult present. The club cannot accept liability for any injury.
