Membership fees are due on 1st September and must be paid by 30th September.

New joiners are entitled to a 3 week trial for £5 (to cover our costs) and then balance of fees are immediately due.

Fees cover the total membership cost and include annual subscriptions, match fees, festival entrance fees and various other benefits.

Any member who defaults in payment will not be entitled to use the club or to play with club teams until all outstanding payments are made.

Important Insurance Note

Whilst coaching and matches are supervised to minimise the risk of injury, rugby is a physical contact game.

The benefits under the compulsory RFU Insurance Cover are low, even for serious injury, and do not cover loss of earnings.

It is therefore recommended that additional cover be taken out. Please note that the club, its servants, agents or employees will not be responsible for supervising junior players before or after coaching sessions or matches. The RFU encourages players to have an up-to-date tetanus injection.

A properly fitting gum shield is compulsory for all U9 to U12 players and a head guard is also recommended.
